Biography

Bridie began her legal journey as a barrister's research assistant and solicitor at Freehills (now Herbert Smith Freehills) practising in Litigation and Intellectual Property. She was subsequently a lecturer at the Faculty of Law, University of Sydney, lecturing in Litigation and Evidence and Administrative Law.

In 2004 - 2005, Bridie was the associate to the Honourable Justice James L. B. Allsop, then a Justice of the Federal Court, subsequently the President of the Court of Appeal of New South Wales, and now the Chief Justice of the Federal Court of Australia.

Bridie is passionately dedicated to education and practitioner development. She has lectured in Advocacy, Planning Law and Administrative Law at the Australian College of Law and in Administrative Law, Litigation and Evidence and Legal Professional Responsibility at the University of Sydney. She is the unit co-ordinator for Administrative Law at the University of New England. She frequently presents at legal conferences on a variety of legal topics. She is an active participant in professional and university mentoring schemes and is a frequent judge assisting with university mooting competitions, including the Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Competition.

Bridie is a Dispute Resolution Service Assessor and Merits Reviewer appointed under the State Insurance Regulatory Authority 2017 Claims Assessment Scheme and CARS assessor under the 1999 Scheme for CTP motor vehicle claims.
